




#### **MAP/TESTING SCORES**

SJS currently administers the Measure of Academic Progress (MAP) assessment three times throughout the school year to assess achievement and growth in Reading, Mathematics, and Language usage. The MAP assessment is a computerized adaptive test developed by the Northwest Evaluation Association (NWEA).

Saint James Catholic School provides formation for the whole child in the intellectual and moral virtues so that each student may contribute to the community as a disciple of Jesus Christ. Students and teachers attend Mass each week, celebrating the liturgical seasons and saints of the Church throughout the school year.

#### **Faith Rally**

In celebration of Catholic Schools Week, SJS students participated in a Faith Rally. It began with an all-school Mass, followed by adoration for each grade level and a Eucharistic Procession throughout the school.

#### **Living Wax Museum**

In celebration of the Solemnity of All Saints, SJS presented a Living Wax Museum. Seventh graders dressed as a designated saint and shared brief stories about the saint's life with parents and visitors who attended. More than 30 saints were represented.

#### St. Thomas Aquinas Major Relics

SJS was provided a very unique opportunity - to host the major relics (first class) of St. Thomas Aquinas (a 13th century Dominican priest and theologian of the Church). The relics were on display during and after Mass for veneration. St. Thomas is a patron saint of students. Dominican Father Pier Giorgio accompanied the relics and explained to our students the difference in "class" of relics. He encouraged our students and visitors to take away a third class relic by touching an item to the first class relic on display. The relics are on "tour" in the United States, and have been visiting several major cities/churches.







#### **Passion Play**

For more than 20 years, SJS eighth grade students have presented a production of the Passion of Christ during Holy Week at Saint James Catholic Church.

#### **Stations of the Cross**

In April, Archbishop Shelton joined Saint James parishioners in the Saint James Cemetery to pray the Stations of the Cross. SJS middle school students made the trip to the cemetery to join them in prayer as well. The students participated in the prayer by representing each of the stations and participating in the readings. The Stations of the Cross represent various scenes of Jesus' passion and death acknowledged during Lent ahead of the Easter holiday. Each Friday during Lent, Catholic Cemeteries across the region host the Way of the Cross for Young Christians.

#### **May Crowning**

Through May Crowning, our students learn to connect with their faith, reflect on virtues, and engage in a communal expression of their beliefs, helping them develop a strong foundation in their religious journey.

#### Middle School House System

The SJS House System nurtures growth in maturity, leadership, community and faith. Each sixth grade student is inducted into one of six houses and remains a part of that house during their middle school years. Houses meet once a month, compete in friendly competitions and team-building activities and complete a community service project.









## **ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT**

SJS finished 2nd Place Overall in the KY Governor's Cup District Finals. The SJS Quick Recall team finished in 2nd place, securing a trip to the Regional competition. The following students won individual awards and advanced to compete at Regionals:

SJS sixth graders were selected for the Preparing for Success Scholarships from Magnolia Bank: Aaron Clark, Allison Villasenor Gil, Ava Grace Dowell, Cambree Spilman and Charlie Paynter. Each of these students submitted an essay about their future career aspirations. All of the winners were invited to a celebratory pizza party and given a \$100 CD from Magnolia Bank.

Annabeth Clarkson, McKenna Menold and Sarah Haney earned gold medals during the Kentucky National History Day competition in April. The trio went on to compete at the National level at the University of Maryland.

Two SJS students who were selected as winners of the 2024 Season of Creation Poster Contest, hosted by the Archdiocese of Louisville's Creation Care Team! Isabella Davis won first place in the contest for the Grades 3-5 category, and Clara Groh won first place for Grades 6-8. Both students were awarded with a \$150 prize.

Fifth grader Janslee Wilkins was included in The Record publication for her artistic depiction of Our Lady of the Rosary.

Allison Villasenor was awarded the annual Amy Alicna Award for the following attributes - scholarship, cooperation, courtesy, self control, work and study habits, as well as spiritual development. This was the 40th year the award has been presented and Mr. and Mrs. Alicna got to be on campus for the presentation.


# SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

SJS awarded two scholarships last year. Cambree Spilman received the Amy Alicna Scholarship, and Addison Peak received the Angela Kirchner Memorial Scholarship.

The Amy Alicna Scholarship Fund was established by Brian and Lindsey Alicna in 2019 to help provide a Catholic education to a Saint James parishioner who may not otherwise have the opportunity. Brian and his sister Amy were SJS students when Amy passed away in 1986 as a sixth grader.

The Angela Kirchner Memorial Scholarship was established last year by SJS fifth grade teacher Patty Kirchner and her husband, Paul, to honor the memory of their daughter, Angela.

Both scholarships are made possible through partnerships with the Central Kentucky Community Foundation (CKCF) and their namesakes.

In November, SJS hosted its annual Veterans Day Celebration, providing students with an opportunity to learn about and honor military veterans. LTC, VC Noel Kubat emceed the event, which included special presentations, musical tributes, the Fort Knox Recruiting and Retention College Color Guard and keynote address by LTC Adam Zerr, U.S. Army Human Resources Command.

#### **Room at the Inn Service Project**

Some of our 7th and 8th grade students visited Room in the Inn to deliver all of the items we collected during our Catholic Schools Week service project drive. SJS students and families donated a variety of items last week from personal care items to laundry detergent, coffee, etc.













#### **Pajama Drive Service Project**

SJS kindergarten and 1st grade students participated in the annual SJS pajama drive. They collected pajamas and donated them to an organization within the community where they were distributed to children in need. This year, SJS students collected 151 pairs of pajamas, which was a record amount!

#### **Tai Sy Le Service Project**

Saint James Catholic School middle school students participated in a middle school service project to clean up areas of Freeman Lake. The project is made possible by the Tai Sy Le Memorial Fund of Central Kentucky Community Foundation (CKCF). The purpose of the endowment is to provide funds each year to support a community service project in memory of Tai Sy Le.

#### **Community Breakfast**

In November, SJS hosted its annual Community Breakfast event, giving students the chance to host business and community leaders for food, fellowship and a fun-filled program. The event is held in celebration of Discover Catholic Schools Week.

#### **Black and White Knight Auction and Gala**

Saint James Catholic School's Black & White Knight Gala celebrated its 12 anniversary with a "Knight to Remember". The event raises funds to enhance Saint James' ability to provide the finest possible Catholic education for its students and keep faculty salaries competitive. The event raised \$120,000 to support the school's operating budget.

#### **KY GIVES DAY**

SJS has participated in the 24-hour online giving day seven of the past eight years. This year, \$40,000 in matching gifts were received for the day. The grand total of all gifts and prizes Saint James received for the day was \$80,000. Saint James finished first ahead of more than 300 nonprofit organizations throughout the state in dollars raised during the event. Funds raised during the event will work to elevate the SJS athletic program with the following:

- Purchase of AEDs and First Aid Kits for all competition and practice sites.
- Upgrade equipment to allow SJS athletes to train well and be more competitive among the leagues in which they compete.
- Assessment of all team uniforms and to bring all sports up to a standard that represents SJS well

In addition, the amount raised will allow SJS to begin planning for future athletic facility needs on campus providing more practice space for all athletes.
