



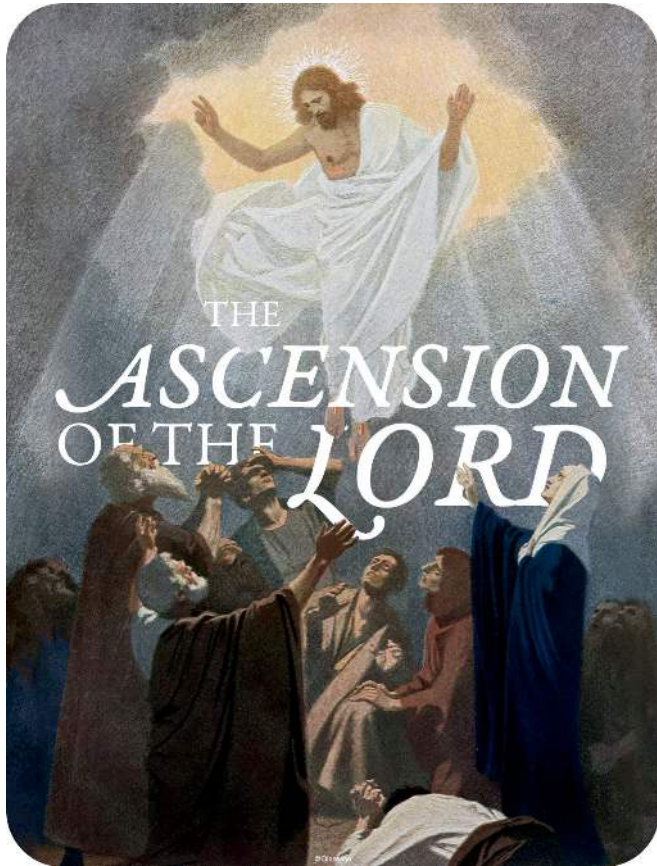

HUMAN LIFE EXALTED

Jesus prayed on the night before he died, “Father, give me the glory I had with you before the world began.” How is the glory he has in the Ascension different from the glory he had “before the world began?” It differs only in that now, he has it in a human nature. Our humanity has been taken to the heights of heaven, fulfilling the destiny God intended for human life from the beginning. Revelation 3:21 declares, “To the one who gains the victory, I will give the right to sit with me on my throne.” God’s plan for us is not just that we will gather around the throne or fall down before the throne, but that we will sit with him on the throne! This hope extended to the human family by the Gospel is directly contradicted when the same human beings destined for the heights of heaven are attacked by violence, degraded in their dignity, or put to death by things like abortion. The human nature Jesus brings to glory in the Ascension is the same human nature you and I share, and the same human nature that the babies in the womb share. Celebrating the Ascension in daily life means treating each human life as one destined to sit with Christ on his throne.

...[U]se this Sunday as a launching point to pray each day this week to the Holy Spirit, as we approach Pentecost. The Spirit, who is the Advocate, makes us advocates when he fills our hearts – advocates for the weakest and most vulnerable among us, including the unborn. **THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD
LOOK, UP IN THE SKY!**

Around holidays, people tend to look fondly back on past celebrations and romanticize old relationships. For some, remembering the past is the best part of their holiday. That is the image we get from the first reading as the apostles look up to heaven after the Ascension.

We too sometimes look at the great feasts of Christmas and Easter in that way. We may dwell on the beauty of the decorations, on the innocence of the baby Jesus, on the horror of his passion and death, or on the wonder of his resurrection. Then when the holy day is over, we go back to our normal routine. Perhaps we need an angel to chide us for “looking at the sky.”

The angels were trying to tell the apostles two things. One was that Jesus would return as he left—in glory. This was not a time to say goodbye, but a time of hope; the Lord who had changed their lives so radically would change the world next.

The second thing the angels were telling them was to begin following Jesus’ command to spread the Good News to all nations. Because of what the apostles accomplished, we are now Jesus’ witnesses to the world. We too have the hope of seeing Jesus come in glory, even as we see him now with the eyes of faith.

Durante las fiestas, la gente suele recordar con cariño las celebraciones pasadas e idealizar las relaciones antiguas. Para algunos, recordar el pasado es la mejor parte de las fiestas. Esa es la imagen que obtenemos de la primera lectura, cuando los apóstoles miran al cielo después de la Ascensión.

Nosotros también a veces contemplamos las grandes fiestas de Navidad y Pascua de esa manera. La segunda cosa que los ángeles les decían era que comenzarían a seguir el mandato de Jesús de difundir la Buena Nueva a todas las naciones. Gracias a lo que los apóstoles lograron, ahora somos testigos de Jesús ante el mundo. Nosotros también tenemos la esperanza de ver a Jesús venir en gloria, y mientras tanto lo vemos ahora con los ojos de la fe. *Tom Schmidt*

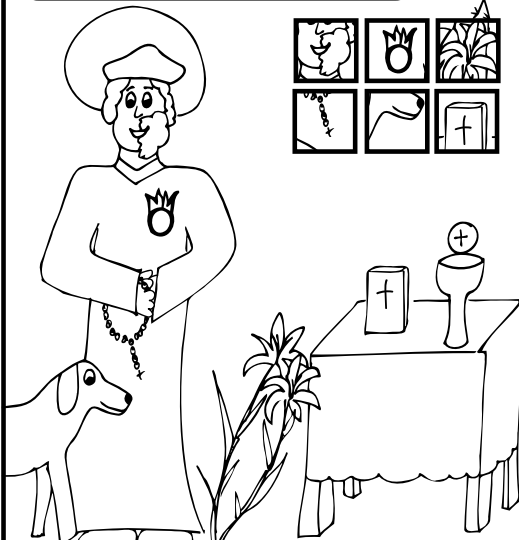
